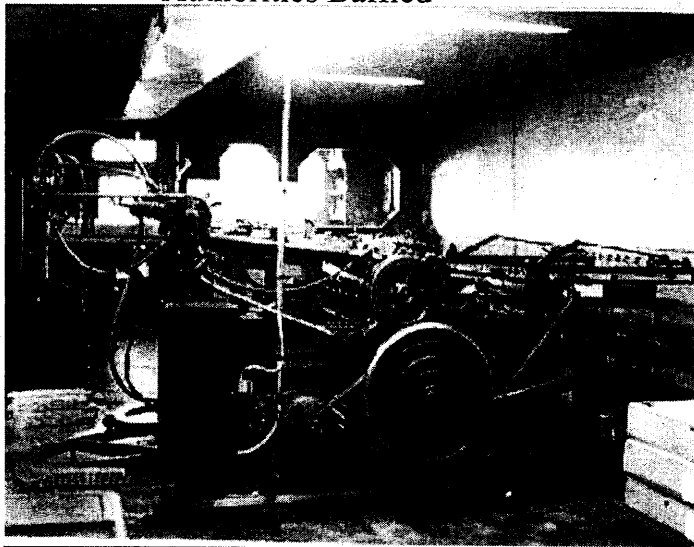
Authorities Baffled

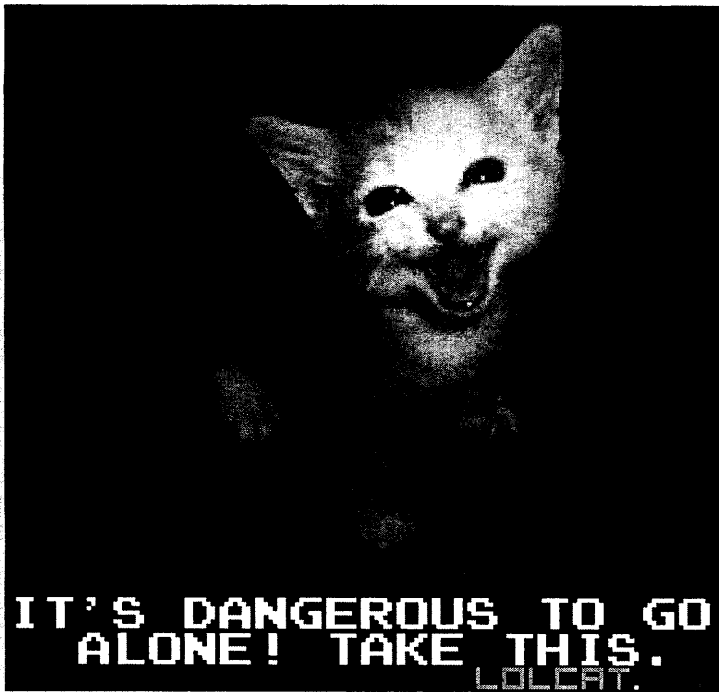
